Reflections with Pope Francis The Most Innocent Among Us



Among the vulnerable for whom the Church wishes to care with particular love and concern are unborn children, the most defenseless and innocent among us... The Church cannot be expected to change her position of this question...

It is also true that we have done little to adequately accompany women in very difficult situations, where abortion appears as a quick solution to their profound anguish, especially when the life developing within them is the result of rape or a situation of extreme poverty. Who can remain unmoved before such painful situations?

Reflection: *The church's position on abortion is a beautiful stand for human life from its earliest stages. But we must also help women who are in crisis pregnancies. Do you have a pro-life crisis pregnancy center in your area? Ask them what they need and spread the word in your parish.*

Sanctity of Human Life Sunday

We are excited about the Sanctity of Human Life Sunday multid denominational service planned for January 21, 2018, because this year's event will be jointly sponsored by the Care Net Pregnancy Center and hosted by the Strongs Community Bible Church.

President Ronald Reagan created the Sanctity of Human Life Sunday by proclamation in 1984. It is a day for all American to focus on the value of each and every human life. This year is the 45th anniversary of Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton, which legalized abortion in every state for any reason through all nine months of pregnancy. This multid denominational service with prayer and fellowship will be at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday, January 21st, at the Strongs Community Bible Church located on M-28 in Strongs.


