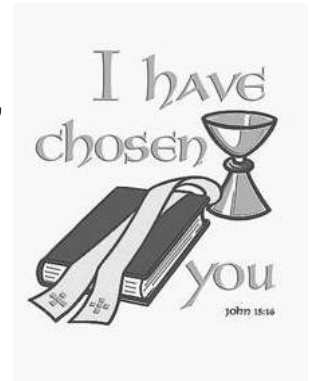
The True Meaning of Freedom




