Reflections with Pope Francis

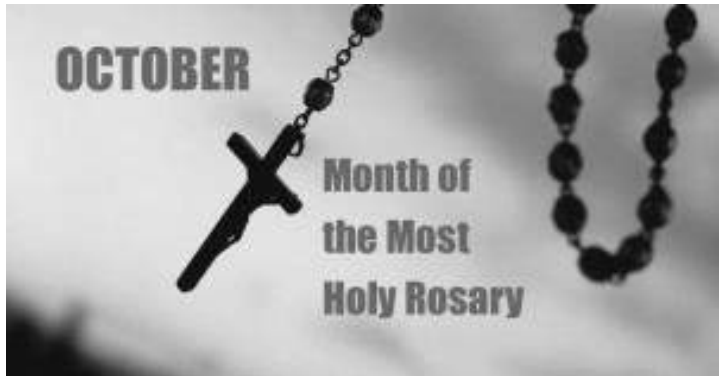


**Protect Your Families




