Reflections with Pope Francis

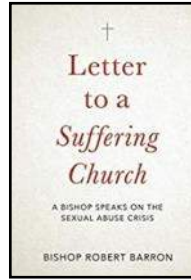
Clouds of Indifference


