Reflections with Pope Francis

God Remembers



There is no profession or social condition, no sin or crime of any kind, that can erase from the memory and the heart of God even one of his children. God remembers, always, he never forgets those who he created. He is the Father, who watchfully and lovingly waits to see the desire to return home be reborn in the hearts of his children. And when he sees this desire, even simply hinted at and so often almost unconsciously, immediately he is there, and by his forgiveness he lightens the path of conversion and return.

Reflection: *What separates you from God? So often we think the separation is due to our sins or weaknesses, but in reality it is often because of our unwillingness to ask for forgiveness or to beg God for his grace and mercy. Take a moment to place your sins and weaknesses in his hands.*

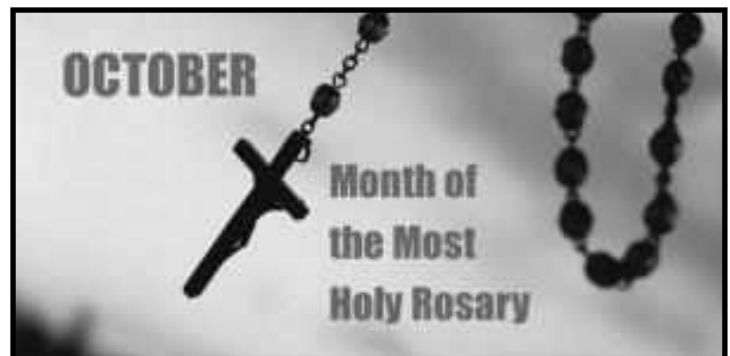
St. John Paul II, Pope

Feast Day: October 22

Saint John Paul II expressed his love for the Rosary many times, even leading the Catholic world in its recitation. The following remarks were made by Pope John Paul II about the Rosary:

The Rosary is marvelous in its simplicity and in its depth. . . . Against the background of the words "Hail Mary," there passes before the eyes of the soul the main episodes in the life of Jesus Christ. They are composed altogether of the joyful, sorrowful, and glorious mysteries, and put us into living communion with Jesus through his Mother's heart.

At the same time our heart can enclose in these decades of the Rosary all the facts that make up the life of an individual, the family, the nation, the church and all humankind. They include personal matters and those of our neighbor, particularly persons who are closest to us. Thus in the simple prayer of the Rosary beats the rhythm of human life.
