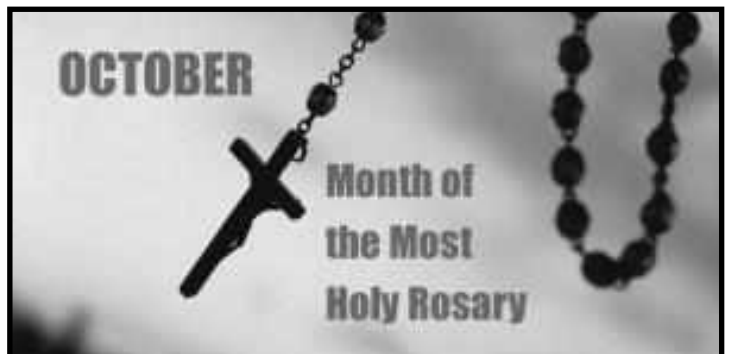
All men of the parish are invited to attend the Wise Men's Retreat.
