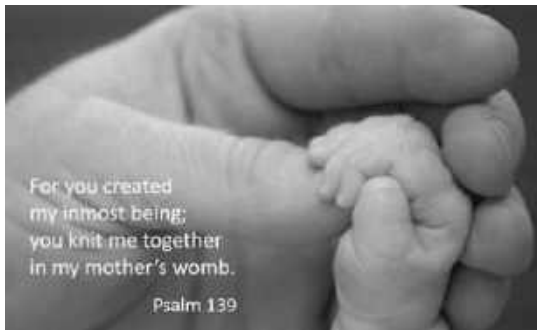

Reflections with Pope Francis

Our Lady Is the One Who Knows Everything



Think about it: when we are too self-confident, we are more fragile—much more fragile. Always with the Lord, with the Lord! And when we say “with the Lord,” we mean with the Eucharist, with the Bible, with prayer ... but also with the family, with our mother, also with her, because she is the one who brings us to the Lord; she is the mother, she is the one who knows everything.
