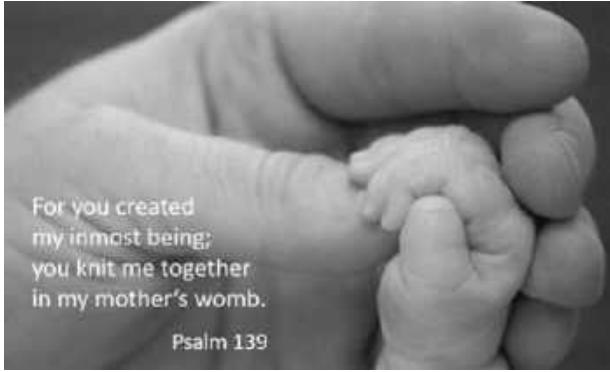

Reflections with Pope Francis

It Is Not An Easy Journey

In proclaiming the beatitudes, Jesus asks us to follow him and to travel with him along the path of love, the path that alone leads to eternal life. It is not an easy journey, yet the Lord promises us his grace, and he never abandons us.

We face so many challenges in life: poverty, distress, humiliation, the struggle for justice, persecutions, the difficulty of daily conversion, the effort to remain faithful to our call to holiness, and many others. But if we open the door to Jesus and allow him to be part of our lives, if we share our joys and sorrows with him, then we will experience the peace and joy that only God, who is infinite love, can give.

Reflection: *Reflect on your own joys and sorrows. Imagine that Jesus is sitting next to you. Have a conversation with him about them. Ask him to make his mercy more a part of your life.*
