

### **Pope Francis' Prayer for Peace**

Lord God of peace, hear our prayer! We have tried so many times and over so many years to resolve our conflicts by our own powers and by the force of our arms. Ste. Anne's Church has a long and rich history that began over 300 years ago. The Jesuits established their mission in 1670, beginning the presence of the Christian faith on the Island. The birch bark chapel was first located on Mackinac Island, then moved to St. Ignace, on the north shore of the straits, then Mackinaw City, on the south shore of the straits, and finally back to the Island, across the ice, in 1779.

Our written records date back to April 1695 and since that time our parish has seen the area occupied by the French, twice by the British and twice by the Americans. The parish has witnessed the rise and fall of the fur trade, the military garrison, and the fishing industry.

We welcome residents, seasonal employees, and all visitors to Mackinac Island. By worshipping in our parish you join a Roman Catholic tradition dating back 2,000 years and a 300 year old faithful Island community. By joining us, you are no longer a stranger here.

### **Reflections with Pope Francis**

#### **What Does Hatred Come From?**



The saints never hated. Understand this well: love is of God, then from whom does hatred come? Hatred does not come from God but from the devil! And the saints removed themselves from the devil; the saints are men and women who have joy in their hearts, and they spread it to others. Never hate, but serve others, the most needy; pray and live in joy. This is the way to holiness.

**Reflection:** *The letter to the Romans tells us, "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good" (12:9-21). Is your love genuine? Is it joyful?
